

Remote Learning 2020/21 Action Plan

In September 2020, all our classes returned to full-time education following the Covid 19 closure in March. Due to the impacts of the pandemic, there is the possibility that an individual child, a class or year group bubble or the whole school, will need to self-isolate for a period of time. In order to ensure that learning for children is continued, irrespective of lockdown and self-isolation, St Luke's Church of England (Aided) Primary School has developed the following plan. This plan offers remote learning opportunities whilst also acknowledging that some households have limited access to devices and would require hard-copies of work and resources.

This plan will be applied in the following instances:

- 1. An individual is self-isolating because of a positive test within the household
- 2. A whole year group 'bubble' is self-isolating because of an outbreak of coronavirus
- 3. School is closed to most children except those who are deemed Vulnerable or children of parents/carers who are Critical Key Workers.

What will my child be taught and Time expectations?

Children will be expected to complete a range of work throughout the day:

- Maths
- Reading
- Writing
- Spelling/Phonics
- Topic (Foundation subjects learning linked to the year group curriculum)

Within all plans, teachers will set appropriate work in-line with our current curriculum and sufficient to cover a normal session for Nursery children and 3-4 hours for Reception to Year 6.

How will my child be taught?

- Nursery children will be taught via Microsoft Sway Nursery Home Learning Day 1 (office.com) which will be sent to Parents/Carers on a daily basis via Teachers2Parents or email. Parents and children can then comment, share and upload their work via Padlet.
- Reception to Year 6 children will be taught through Microsoft Teams. Children will be either directed to:
 - ✓ Microsoft Sways Reception Remote Learning Monday 18th January 2021 (office.com) / Tuesday 2nd February (office.com)

✓ Teams Assignments: shared on their class channel on Teams



- ✓ Pre-recorded video / audio links of their class teachers: shared on their class channel on Teams https://www.loom.com/share/c84a93febe7149478a93d284a2014e24
- ✓ Recorded teaching i.e. RWI (Phonics); Oak Academy and BBC Bitesize. The 'teaching content' will be provided to children through age appropriate video content on the DfE published list of educational resources site; Oak National Academy website https://classroom.thenational.academy/ This provides the equivalent of 3 hours of lessons per day for primary school children. In their 'classroom' each lesson is an hour-long. They're delivered by a teacher, with a pre-recorded video as well as quizzes, worksheets and creative activities. It's all easy to use, there's no login or password, and you can access the lessons on any device pupils only need materials they can find at home.
 BBC Bitesize https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/this-terms-topics Staff will guide the children whether to use BBC Bite Size or the Oak Academy. Feel free to do extra. Children can select their year group and subject, then complete a relevant learning activity linked to their classroom learning.
- ✓ Home Learning Packs: printed paper activities, resources and worksheets related to online teaching and learning delivered to homes.
- ✓ Knowledge Organisers: Curriculum focused work as shown on Knowledge Organisers Y1 6.


Contact with Parents/Carers and children

- Nursery children will remain in contact with their class teachers through Padlet.
- Reception to Year 6 children will remain in contact with their class teachers through Microsoft Teams.

Padlet and Microsoft Teams will support school in offering online learning with the opportunity for the children to upload photos and videos as well as comment on posts. Children and parents will be able to message teachers throughout the school day, 'dropping-in' to receive further support in their home learning.

With regards to providing feedback, children can send any completed work to teachers via Padlet/Microsoft Teams. Alternatively, work that children complete on paper should be kept safe and returned to school when safe to do so.

Home Learning Packs (Worksheets and practical resources)

These will be provided in the following situations:

- ✓ If a child is isolated from school i.e. the child is sent home from school to either receive a test or self-isolate as someone in the household is being tested, they will receive a home learning pack and their own stationery. Children will have immediate opportunity to continue their learning.
- ✓ If a whole year group bubble is self-isolating, all children in the bubble will receive a home learning pack and their own stationery. Children will have immediate opportunity to continue their learning. The initial response to any isolation will be to provide children with home learning materials alongside their class stationery pack (these may need to be delivered). In the case of a whole year group 'bubble' closure, tasks for home learning will be uploaded to Padlet/Microsoft Teams from the first day of the closure.
- ✓ For children with specific SEND needs, individualised learning packs and resources will be provided which are link to their SEND targets or IEPs.

Device Access

If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop and/or the internet, the school will do all it can to support children and will provide paper packs of learning. Where funding can be accessed, remote devices (eg, laptops) and/or 4G connections will be sought, particularly for disadvantaged children. Parents will be reminded to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.
