Any ways our school could be improved?

Comments re. Homework and Learning

- Teachers can give some homework in their books in holidays if possible
- I think homework books should be reintroduced so that it is more structured from day to day.
- Less children in one class for better results
- Talk about new topics and other religions.
- Just one thing when kids passed from one class and going to another class you don't appreciate kids with certificates and any trophies because other schools do this

This academic year, we have again looked at our Homework policy. Homework is a contentious issue for many schools and parents – some parents/carers love and want more homework; other parents/carers do not want any as they believe children spend all day in school learning and therefore, should have time to play at home plus for many, homework can cause issues at home. In light of this, we have tried to find a balance which will hopefully suit all.

- We have continued with our weekly programme of activities which is shared every week via Microsoft Teams – please ensure that you check your child's Teams account each week. This work can be completed in their purple books.
- In addition, there are lots of websites and apps available on our school website which children can access and also, our maths lead, Mrs Parkes has produced a variety of maths booklets which will be shared with you throughout the year for your children to practise key skills
- We really want our children to enjoy their learning and complete home learning activities to supplement their learning in school. We will always recognise those children who complete tasks at home and share them with us.

As a school, we do not agree with giving children homework during weekends or holidays, children need to relax, rest and recharge.

With regards to having less children in classes so that they can achieve better results, we have used our Covid Catch-up funding and also, additional funding to enable each year group to have at least 2.5 Teachers. This means that the children for Reading, Maths and English are being taught in 3 groups within each year group. We are hoping that having an improved teacher: child ratio will enhance learning and lead to improved results.

Finally, we are always reviewing our curriculum to ensure that it is appropriate and relevant for our children. We introduced new topics last year in some year groups and we also ensure that although we are a Church School, we have always taught our children about Sikhism, Islam and other religions.

Comments re. Parents/Carers and Staff relationships

- Parents should also be listened to and taken serious when they have a child that is hurt in school
- Improved parent-teacher engagements.
- Communicating as much as possible directly to the parents instead of via pupils. I know St Lukes does this as best they can but some things do tend to fall through the cracks
- I know we have had some challenging times recently, i do think better communications with parents, as in some notice would be helpful.

If you are at all concerned about the well-being of your child, always speak to the class teacher in the first instance. If you feel you have not been listened to or taken seriously, speak to a member of the Senior Leadership Team (Mrs Smith – Early Years; Mrs Aldridge – Key Stage 1 (Y1&2); Mrs Bannister – KS2a (Y3&4); Mrs Parkes – KS2b (Y5&6); Mrs Grennan – Headteacher).

As you will see from our calendar this year, we have plenty of opportunities for parents and carers to attend school events and speak to teachers – we hope to see you there!

Regarding communication, we do try to communicate in a variety of ways including: letters, text messages, emails, phone calls, Microsoft teams and face to face conversations at the door as well as scheduled meetings. The weekly newsletter is fabulous for keeping up to date with what's going on! We know that compared to lots of other schools, our communication (although not perfect) is good. However, if you are ever unsure of anything, please do phone, email, ask on the school Facebook page or come into school and speak to the office staff or the class teacher.

Comments re. Children

- Implementing and sustaining the constant training of children for most or all sports related activities in readiness for school competitions.
- Kids reaction to each other on playground should be checked
- Just one thing when kids passed from one class and going to another class you don't appreciate kids with certificates and any trophies because other schools do this

In addition to our varied PE curriculum, this term we are offering extra curricular football, dance, sports hall athletics, netball, dance and lots more. We also have plenty of competitions and other opportunities planned for this year so watch this space!

Comments re. Lunchtimes and Site issues

- Parking
- Extra time for lunch time

- Larger portions of school meals. Problems with children at lunchtimes need to be dealt with better.

- Does the school have rights to the walking path outside the school the ones near to the nursery entrance? A lot of children play on the paths during the summer holidays but there is broken glass outside on the paths. Is there any way can this be resolved? Thank you

We agree that parking is an issue at St Luke's, as it is at many schools. We will continue to remind parents and carers to park legally and safely and we will be encouraging families to walk to and from school when possible. Unfortunately, school is not responsible for the Blakenhall Gardens area – this includes the grass and the paths. We can only encourage you to contact the City Council and we will too.

Regarding lunchtimes, our children have a whole hour for lunch time, plus morning break and comfort breaks during afternoons – this is far more than most schools. If your child has informed you that they are still hungry following their school dinner, please let the class teacher know so that (as long as they are clearing their plate) the servers can give your child a larger portion. We have a varied and nutritious menu at St Luke's, and even our staff agree that it is rather tasty! If your child is unhappy with the choices, please see the class teacher, who can guide your child in choosing food to their tastes.

With regards to issues between children at lunchtimes, again, all staff do try really hard to establish what has happened in order to resolve the issue and move forward – we follow the Restorative Practice approach.
