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

- To understand national expectations









Children need to orally blend sounds Fred Games

Set 1 Sounds!

Set 1 Special Friends


Two letters one sound

We teach the children to use Fred Talk to read green words




Begin with CVC words

e.g. mat mad dad sad sat

Word time words 1:1 - 1:7


Using sound buttons to show fred talk

cat think




Writing Set 1 sounds

- Continue to practise saying sounds at speed
- To learn to write all of them starting at scared or brave monkey (Kinetic letter tree)
- Ensure the children have the 3 friends hold.
- Use hand exercises to support writing

What is the first sound? What is the middle sound? What is the last sound?






<u>Alien Words</u>

ap vip




Red words

- Words that must be learnt by sight!
- There are 3 sets.
- Reception children should know at least set 1 at speed and recognise them in books



What are red words?

- Common words - High frequency words



Ditty
1: a cat Speed sounds
ctaherdf Green words
cat red fat in hat
a cat in a hat
a fat cat in a hat
a fat cat in a red hat



Question to talk about: What does the cat look like? Hold a sentence: A fat cat.

Reading CVCC words


When reading 3 letter green words at speed then children move on to these words.

blob hand skip drop





The Web (green) This is Spin. Spin is sitting in his web. "Six bugs are stuck in my web," said Spin.




Set 2 Sounds


- These are two letters together that make one sound - digraph
- Including long vowel sounds ay, ee, igh, ow, oo, oo
































Ideas for working with your child at home

- Talk to your child, increasing their vocabulary
 Say silly tongue twisters
- •Lots of stories traditional tales/fairy tales
- •Use ditties to support writing sounds
- •Revisit nursery rhymes again and again!
