

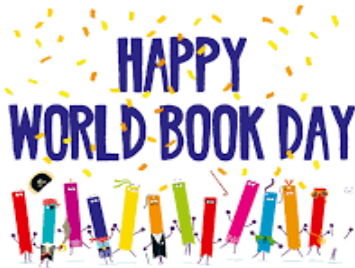

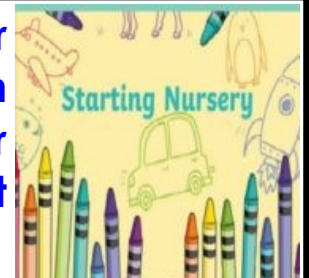

Jewellery

Can I remind parents/carers that jewellery is not part of our school uniform. We are having an increasing number of children coming into school wearing hooped earrings and necklaces, etc. No bangles should be worn to school unless worn for religious purposes.

Jewellery is a safety hazard, especially at playtimes, when children are dressing up in role play and in PE lessons. If parents insist that earrings are worn because of pierced ears, then these must be small studs and not of loops/dropper earrings. Also make sure religious bangles are loose enough to remove when a health and safety risk ie PE or injury. Thank you!
